



## FOURTH GRADE SUMMER READING

Dear Parents and Students,

Summer is here, and that means it's time for Summer Reading! You are expected to pick **two** books from the list below and choose an activity to complete for each book.

Please turn in your two summer reading activities on the first day of school!

***Please pick one option below for each book:***

<b>Write a letter to the author</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Use proper letter formatting (heading, greeting, closing, and signature)</li><li>• Tell the author what you liked about the book and what you would change. Make sure to explain why!</li><li>• Ask the author some questions (ex. Why they chose a certain setting or about a specific character)</li></ul>
<b>Write two diary entries for the main character</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Write two diary/journal entries from the perspective of the main character.</li><li>• These entries should mention specific events from the story.</li><li>• Each diary entry should be at least 5-7 sentences.</li></ul>
<b>Create a new ending for the book</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Write the ending of the story that <i>you</i> would have chosen.</li><li>• It should be at least 2 paragraphs and should make sense with the rest of the story.</li></ul>
<b>Summarize the book in comic book form.</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The comic should include at least 5 detailed frames.</li></ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each section should include an illustration and a brief sentence about what is happening in the frame.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Write a book review for your classmates.</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write about the setting of the story, the main characters, and major events <b>(do not give away the ending!)</b></li> <li>• Tell your classmates what you enjoyed about this book – give specifics!</li> <li>• Say who you would recommend this book to and why.</li> <li>• If there is anything you did not like, you can include that as well!</li> </ul>
